### **Open House and Archaeological Dig**

June 8<sup>th</sup> is Connecticut Open House Day, an annual event coordinated by the Connecticut Office of Tourism. The Nellie McKnight Museum will be open from 10-4. ### **Online catalog**

PastPerfect Museum Software hosts our data and Web sized images on their Web servers for a modest annual fee so that we don’t need to maintain our own servers. PastPerfect-Online is a fully searchable website. We currently have about 668 catalog records and 490 images online, thanks to Jim Long, who has been photographing the objects in the collection.

PastPerfect is now going to submit our site to the search engines Google and Bing for indexing at no charge to us. This will make our catalog discoverable on the Internet.
